The CCE's Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) is a standardized examination administered by Pearson. According to Pearson, "The Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) is an evaluation tool that assesses students' competence of foundational, counseling-related knowledge. The CPCE is designed to assess students who have completed graduate-level courses; courses that are grounded primarily in a counseling curriculum. Because of the depth and breadth of the tool to evaluate an individual's academic training, the CPCE parallels the nationally recognized standards published by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP)." The examination assesses several areas of professional development including: Assessment and Testing, Career Development, Counseling and Helping Relationships, Group Counseling and Group Work, Human Growth and Development, Professional Counseling Orientation, Ethical Practice, Research and Program Evaluation, and Social and Cultural Diversity. Thus, it assesses all SLOs in our program. This assessment is administered during the final semester of a student's program (i.e., Spring semester of their second year for full-time students or Spring semester of their third year for part-time students).

IWhat were the findings from this	Performance of our students on last year's paper and pencil examination indicated that 100% of students met expectations for all six SLOs. In Spring 2018, we will be administering the examination using Pearson's online platform.
improvement? Where applicable,	We will be administering this examination each spring with students who are about to complete our program. Our plan is to use the data to assess how well our curriculum prepares students each of the specific areas assessed by the test (i.e., Assessment and Testing, Career Development, Counseling and Helping Relationships, Group Counseling and Group Work, Human Growth and Development, Professional Counseling Orientation and Ethical Practice, Research and Program Evaluation, and Social and Cultural Diversity) with an emphasis on those that address our SLOs.

Provide enough detail	To be certified as a school counselor in the state of Pennsylvania, students are required to pass the PRAXIS examination (Professional School Counselor (5421) examination with a score of 156 or better. Our school counseling students take this examination during their final semester in the program. This exam covers all six SLOs for our program.
What were the findings from this assessment?	In the last year of administration, all of our students passed the PRAXIS examination. Our students' overall scores ranged from 164 to 178, meeting or exceeding expectations.
